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Upper Salt River Rafting Starts March 1st!

Recent Snowfall in Arizona Brings on a Fun-Filled Salt Season

Mild to Wild Rafting is excited to announce March 1st as the start of the 2013 Arizona rafting season on the Upper Salt River. Because this wilderness section is above Roosevelt Dam it depends on snowmelt rather than a dam release for its water level. The recent storms have increased snow pack to a level that will offer a fun-filled river experience; and any additional snow in the mountains will only enhance water flows and lengthen the 2013 rafting season.

"We are really excited for the spring 2013 Salt River season. With a little luck from Mother Nature, this season promises to be the best in years!" states Alex Mickel, President of Mild to Wild Rafting. Mid March to mid April will be the best time to catch the higher water levels which prove great for rafting, but don't worry, the season will last through early to mid May. Also offered on the Salt River are inflatable kayak trips. These smaller, single person water crafts provide wild entertainment on the river at lower water levels which can normally be caught after mid April through the end of the season.

"We cannot wait to get back to the Salt River Canyon so we can share the experience on the river that we love," comments Joe Spillyards, Mild to Wild's Arizona Operations Manager.
